



Program / Speaker

Program:— Larry Caplan introduced our speaker, Cliff McCool, with the Barrett-Jackson Auction Company. The club asked Cliff many questions about his experiences with B/J and we learned a lot of new facts! As of Jan 18, 2018, Cliff got the permit he has been needing and is now ready to pour cement later this month. Cliff has been with B/J for 11 years. His job is to move the cars onto the red autotion block, open the hoods, then move off. Average time car is on the block is 90 seconds to 2 minutes! Over 1800 hoods are lifted each year. Auctions are held in Scottsdale, Palm Beach, Connecticut, and Las Vegas.

Coming soon Texas may be added this year. Average price on cars is \$18,000-\$30,000. Popular sale items recently are the Resto-Rods. To put a car into auction, seller puts up \$500-\$600. Buyers (bidders) must bring with them either a letter from the bank verifying funds or they bring a suitcase of cash. Bidders pay an admission price of \$550.

Cliff has no other side job to this. He has always loved cars. All cars up to auction are inspected by B/J. Four B/J experts go over the cars on a rack and check they are according to a "description" provided by sellers. Cliff still warns to buyers to beware. Check these cars "on-line" and talk to the sellers before the auction. Buyers


also need to set a limit for themselves. There are 3 types of buyers: First time buyers, Collectors, and Dealers.

The highest bid in B/J history is \$2.5 million for car purchased by Rick Hendricks. Cliff describes the auctions as a lot of fun. Of the 5,000 bidders on floor, it only takes two bidders interested in same car to make a bidding war. He says it is a good way to sell and he will continue with B/J as long as he can.
