



### Cliff McKool & Howard Brown

**Howard Brown:** (Using the projector) showed the progress being made on the membership database. Cliff McKool: Talked about this year's Barrett Jackson's Scottsdale Auction. Close to 2000 cars were auctioned during the week plus a large amount of motorabila. Cliff has been an employee of Barret Jackson for many years. They are now moving cars across the selling platform in minutes. Cliff also mentioned that the customs are now bringing more money than the muscle cars. Pick-ups are also bringing big money. (note: Cliff was recognized by the Motortrend announcers on air for his service and for keeping them all safe on stage).

**Howard Brown:** Howard was also in Scottsdale at the Russo and Steele Action where he drove numerous cars onto the selling platform. He described the various ways that they had to go through to start the cars. Another challenge to not hit the patrons that were walking in front of them and taking part in adult beverages. Howard then showed photos of some of the cars that he had driven, He also talked about visiting Barrett Jackson on Sunday. He observed the auction from the stage, (courtesy of Cliff) and showed photos of cars from Barret that he had seen.

### Member Bio,

Prez Ernie Baily

Well, first off I was born in Cedar Rapids Iowa, Moved here to Canoga Park in 1959. When I was about 10 yrs old I started helping my Dad working on cars as he would buy and sell old cars to make extra money for the family. When I was 15 1/2 years old my Dad bought me my first car, a 1955 Dodge Custom Royal Hardtop for \$ 99.00. He and I worked on it, rebuilding the motor only to find out it had a cracked block. So we went to the Junkyard and found a 1958 Plymouth 318 V8 in a pile of old motors and then put it in the car. We then took it to Earl Scheib's and had it painted "Fire Engine Red" for \$29.95! Dad used the car as a second car until I turned 16 yrs old. Thats why I currently have a 55 Dodge now " to relive my youth!". I then had some other Mopars, 1960 Dodge Matador, and two 1964 Plymouth Sport Furys with the 426 wedge motor and 4 speed, one before I went into the Marine Corp in 1968 and another just before I got out of the service. After I got out I traded that one on a 1969 Plymouth Road Runner. I then a few years later bought a number of old cars to buy and sell trying to make extra money. I had wanted to build a Stock Car for Saugas Speedway but decided to lean toward Vintage car restoration due to the fact I knew nothing about racing business and sponsership costs. So I bought a 1947 Ford Pickup that was 1 week away from the crusher. I found it 3 blocks from my home which my Dad told me about. Paid \$75 and we drug it home with my Dads work backhoe. Well we no sooner get it up in the driveway, and my Dad says you have 1 month to get it drivable or its out of here! Then in the next minute he says to me "Let go to the Junkyard and get a Engine & Trans!". That leads me to April 1976 when I joined the "Valley V8 Club". And thats when I started working at Walt Disney Imagineering, which I worked for 27 years. One year later I married my wife Diane in April 1977 "The year Elvis died!" Throught the next few years I bought and sold some other old cars (55 Imperial, 46 Ford 4dr (which I saved from a hippe that was going to cut the top off", It had the six and turned out to be a great car. I also bought a 1940 Ford "Opera" coupe and had that working great. About that time my wife and I had our son "Eric". I had to sell the 47 Pick up because we couldn't fit the car seat in the truck and have room to be able to go anywhere comfortably. I made some good money from the sale of the 47 Ford pickup. So I thought I could do two cars and bought a 1946 Ford Club Coupe and also bought my 48 Plymouth Special Deluxe which was just like my parents first car. Then I had used up all the money and had two nice running cars, but they looked bad. I decided to put them both up for sale and which ever sold first I would invest that money into the finishing the other. Well the 46 Ford sold first and then I took the money from that to invest in my 48 Plymouth, which was just like my Mom and Dads first new car. I then starting to look for another 55 Dodge, which was just like my first car. I now have had this 55 for almost 35 years, and the 48 Plymouth 40+ years. As you know I have been helping my brother with his cars. I continue to have interest in all vintage cars. I just tell everyone "I just want them All!"
