

### Car of the Month:

Handled by Jerry Jensen, won by Phil Goeschl. Now here's another beauty put together by Phil: It's one swell '41 Mercury Eight Coupe, how rare is that! The Mercury was introduced in 1939 as Ford's mid-level line, an answer to GM's Pontiac and Oldsmobile. Edsel Ford was tasked by Henry to develop the line, named after the fleet-footed 'messenger of the gods'. Now Phil is known for his innovative ideas and attention to detail, blending tradition with practicality. And this Mercury doesn't disappoint! It's powered by a flathead Merc, bored and stroked to 270 cubic inches, ported and relieved, hot cam. Running a two-pot Weiand intake and capped with Navarro hi-compression heads, this sweet little mill is backed by a 5-speed with 20% overdrive, so the RPM drop in 5th is just enough. Out back is a Ford 9-inch for durability. And check out the stance. With big 'n little tires back/front and a 2-inch dropped front axle with reversed spring eyes, this Merc sits right! Inside is a stock gray cloth interior with jump seats in the back that contrasts nicely with the medium blue exterior paint. Nice work, Phil, you nailed it, congratulations!

Friday, September 7 Cost \$4/person


Either meet at Woodley Park at 8:15 am and caravan to museum OR meet us there.


### **Our Next Meeting 7 Aug 18**


Howdyy---We have the Aug program lined up Steve Kopito (Rob Gluckman's brother in law)....

**Program:** Ken Sapper introduced his friend and our speaker for the evening, John Larson. Now John has one of the more interesting hobbies known to man: Vintage license plates! Not just a hobby, but a business as well, John buys, sells, and restores license plates. He's been doing this for over 15 years now. For his presentation, he brought along a bunch of license plate samples and some very interesting information about CA license plates. A little history: In 1905, the state of California first required owners to register their motor vehicles. Interestingly, owners had to provide their own license plates for display. So they were able to buy a 'kit' and create their license plates, similar to how you'd set up the street number for your house. From 1920 to 1941, the state issued a new plate each year that displayed the registration year. That changed in 1942 with the U.S. involvement in World War II, when metal became a precious commodity. So in 1942-43, CA issued steel tags that affixed to the top of the plate. In 1944 owners were issued a registration tag affixed to the windshield. Some interesting facts and 'anomalies' about CA license plates: In 1912-13 California issued solid license plates for the rear of the vehicle and screen versions, same numbers, for the front, to prevent air blockage to the radiator. From 1914 to 1919, California license plates were porcelain, with 1914 painted a classy brick red with white lettering. After that, things were simplified and plates issued were made of plain steel. In the mid 1930's, if you had a commercial truck, the license plate had a 'PC' designation, )pneumatic commercial( or 'SC' )Solid commercial( which pertained to what kind of tires were used on the truck. After WWII, in 1947, some plates were made out of aluminum because of steel shortage. In the late 1930's, if you were a politician, you had a three-digit license plate. If you were a movie star, 4-digits. In conclusion, what's the best advice for working with the CA DMV to register vintage plates to your car? Be patient and do your homework/research ahead of time! That includes ensuring that the plates are 'clear'. John can help you with that. Thanks John for a most excellent presentation! Give him a call if you have any questions or if you need to restore or purchase vintage license plates. (626-590-0523).

Anyway, be on the lookout. <u>Specialized plates and working with the DMV</u>: )Advice from Scotty Cramolinni(: If you have vintage license plates and go to the DMV to have them registered to your old car, ask for the 'Y.O.M.') Year of Manufacture( clerk or expert.
