

Car of the Month: Handled by Jerry Jensen, awarded to Walt Hanna and his '47 Ford 4-door police car. An interesting twist: This '47 was a former LA City police car that had emigrated to Oregon. So in 2016 when Walt bought the '47, it was a kind of homecoming for the old Ford. He and a friend drove up to Oregon and towed it back to CA. Now it hadn't run in awhile, so Walt cleaned out the fuel lines, replaced the gas tank, ignition points and spark plugs, added fresh gas, and it fired right up! Since then, Walt has added servo-style brakes from a Ford F-1 truck, which made a real difference in stopping power. He also converted to 12 volts for reliability. It's a six! The most interesting feature of this police car is the engine: Open the hood and you see a very clean 6-cylinder! Now this engine was introduced in 1941, Ford's first flathead six, and designated the G-series engine. Displacing 226 cubic inches, it produced 90 hp. And like the V-8, it was also a flathead or L-head design. This new engine replaced the 'V-8 60'. Remember that one? 136 cubic inches, 60 horsepower the 'economy' flathead V8 introduced in the 1937 Ford. So the new G-series six had a fairly long production run starting in 1941, ending in 1951. For model year 1952, a completely new 215 cubic inch OHV sixcylinder was introduced. A six in a police car? So why did Walt's Ford come with a six vs. a V-8? Well, back in that day, vehicles were 'batch-purchased' by LA City for fleet-use. V-8 or six, it didn't matter to the City, cost was the main consideration. So Walt ended up with one very unique Ford. And it's a beauty! Congratulations Walt, well deserved!










(Monthly Meeting Minutes Continued)

Program: Our speakers for the evening were introduced by Larry Caplan. They included Ed Warnock, Jerry Jensen, Ernie Baily, and Chip Werstein. Ed Warnock was our first speaker. For Ed, it started with a local Meet in Santa Rosa in late 1972 where Ed met Dick Durkee who told him about the Valley V8's. He went to a meeting, then joined. Ed told us the story of the Club president at the time who owed the Club a lot of money. So a bunch of members went to the President's house, 'captured' his 1947 Ford, and sold it to pay back the Club treasury. Early on, the Club met at a Savings & Loan building in Reseda. Ed remembers when actor Jerry Lewis had his fund-raising telethon in the same meeting room. So the Valley V-8'ers were pre-empted to another room during the telethon. Finally, Ed had the distinction of being one of the Club's early presidents, year 1975. Jerry Jensen was up next. It started with a '39 convertible sedan he bought from a guy in Ventura. The body was on the frame, but that was about it. The doors were hanging off the garage rafters, other parts were scattered about, so he knew he'd need help in getting the '39 back together. He saw an ad for the V-8 Club in the local green sheet, so joined club for help on his '39. Jerry recalls Club member Jack Miles as being his mentor. Jack was a very knowledgeable, Ford mechanic. When Jerry first joined, Don Durkee was president and Ed Warnock was Vice President. Jerry was working for the fire department when he joined, and when he retired he became President of the Club for two years, 1989 and 1990. Ernie Bailey was our next speaker: He joined a year before he got married, in April of 1976. Ernie mentioned the camaraderie he experienced in the V-8 Club. It reminded him of close friendships he had in his homeland of West Iowa. He especially admired and appreciated Don Durkee. Ernie's Dad was a car guy, and together they found a '47 Ford, bought it for \$75, and dragged it home three blocks, literally. Ernie says they were lucky to make it. Turns out there was only one U-bolt holding the rear end in! When they got it home, his dad told Ernie they had 6 months to get it running. Together they went to a wrecking yard, bought a '65 Ford 289 engine, shoehorned it into the '47, and got it running. It turned out to be a great father-in-son project. Ernie also had a nifty '46 Ford 4-door sedan with a 6 cylinder. In addition to other Club leadership roles, Ernie took his turn as co-editor of the Club Newsletter with Ed Rose, and also served as Club historian for awhile. Chip Werstein was our last speaker. Chip was also one of our past president's, serving in year 1977. Now Chip's dad was a car collector, and prior to Chip getting out of college, his dad decided he should have a car to restore: So a '37 Ford Phaeton was purchased, and became sort of a father-and-son project. This led to Chip joining the Valley V-8s in July, 1973. Don Durkee was president at the time. Chip mentioned a nice feature of the Savings & Loan meeting location: They met in an upstairs room overlooking the parking lot, so one could see all the old Fords parked down below, how swell is that! Chip, and many of our other speakers, recalled that in the early Club days, there were lots of road tours, including the Gamble House in Pasadena and Beverly Hills Car Club, to name a few. The years went by, and sometime in 1984, Chip drove the '37 Phaeton to San Diego, blew the clutch, towed it home, and parked it. Right around that time, an interest in Corvettes took priority, so for Chip the V-8 Club was temporarily on hold. Time marched on, and more recently, his interest in old Ford's has returned. Turns out that his family has been asking him to get the old '37 Phaeton running again, yep, it's been sitting with that blown clutch since 1984! So Chip's back with us again, and he'll have the Phaeton running in no time. Finally, Chip mentioned something that really exemplifies the Club's camaraderie: A long time ago, the Club was at a car show, and Ed Warnock had to leave early. So he let Chip drive his beautiful black '39 Ford convertible home. Ed's generosity left quite an impression on Chip. He knew beyond a doubt that he was in a club where he was trusted and really belonged, way to go, Ed! In summary, the members had and still do have grease under their fingernails, many in the Club drive their cars while they work on them. Yes, situations have changed, but we're still the same car-people, it's just a few year later. Thanks, fellows, for sharing about our rich heritage as a Club and about the individuals, including yourselves, who make up who we are.


