





# Speaker

Harold Osmer, a friend of Ken and Joan Sapper, is an author and automotive historian. He provided to us a most excellent historical account of automotive race track history in California.

In the early 1900's, Los Angeles was home to the early back garage racing movement along with a legion of race fans, so had many automotive racing venues. The first automobile race track in Southern California was actually a horse race track. In Beverly Hills and Culver City, the auto race tracks were made of wood.

For a time, Long Beach and Santa Monica used city surface streets. Ascot Speedway in Lincoln Heights and Saugus had dirt tracks. And even during the depression, as many as 75,000 spectators filled the grandstands at a race track where LAX now stands, called Mines Field Speedway.

An interesting bit of trivia about the early race tracks: They didn't leave a 'footprint' when they closed. The grandstands, the tracks, whether wood or dirt, the fuel, the cars, parts, etc. were all taken away with very little to mark that they had been there.

And city streets were improved, widened by racing promoters. Harold said that in Southern California, there were over 170 auto race tracks from the early 1900's to the present day. However, over the years, race tracks have dwindled.

The big ones, Riverside, and Ontario are gone. Lyon's Dragstrip closed down because the Port of Los Angeles needed the land for a rail and container depot.

The first generation Irwindale Drag strip closed because of land values. Even Saugus Speedway closed in 1995. And sadly, not one of the old race tracks has a historical marker.

So with the 'new generation' it appears that NASCAR is now somewhat king of automotive racing nationwide. However, locally, Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, has drag racing, and a two-mile oval track for NASCAR, soon to be reduced to 1/2 mile, also Autocross racing. And Irwindale Speedway is going strong as 'gen 2', with 1/8-mile drag racing, drifting, and NASCAR Camping World West Series' events.

Yep, racing is still alive and well in Southern California on a reduced scale.

So Harold has one of the most interesting lives in the land. How did he get into this dream lifestyle? Well, it started 25 years ago when he did his Masters' thesis on '... What Effect Race Tracks Have on the Land', and, low and behold, that thesis grew into a career!

Some of the books Harold has authored are *Where They Raced Turn* 3, and *Auto Racing Venues in Southern California*, 1900 – 2020. He also wrote two additional racing history books, *Saugus Speedway Scrapbook*, and *Real Road Racing*. Additionally, he published *Miss Information's Automotive Calendar of Events*. And he's had a bunch of other interesting opportunities: He was Regional Director for Society of Automotive Historians, he's announced at the Bonneville Sat Flats events, also at Irwindale Speedway. Back in the day, Harold served our country aboard a nuclear submarine.

In summary, Harold has lived and continues to live a most interesting life. Thanks, Harold, for your swell presentation to our group.
