



Covered in medium metallic blue and dressed in white tuck & roll, this is one fine Ford! While young Harvey was in high school, he had a '51 Ford. He sold it, the years went by, and, you know how it is, with good memories of his first '51 still playing in his mind, Harvey just had to have another one. Now the 'new' '51 Ford that Harvey found was a very desirable California-build car, originally came out of the Ford assembly plant in Long Beach, CA. This particular assembly plant was built in 1930 to expand production of the Model A. So new Fords rolled out until late 1958 when the plant was closed because of unstable ground caused by nearby oil drilling, whew! Anyway, Harvey's '51 was sold, re-sold, spent some time out of state for awhile, but meandered back to it's roots in California, ending up with a broker in Palm Desert. That's where Harvey found and purchased this gem. It was looking mighty fine when he bought it, pretty much the same as you see it here, but it needed some sorting out mechanically. So Harvey rolled up his sleeves, and rebuilt/refurbished the suspension and brakes for safety, and sealed up some pesky oil leaks. The engine is the original 8BA flathead, pretty much stock except for dual exhausts and a four barrel carburetor. Thank You, Get well, Prayers do work, and God Bless You Happy New Year



**Program**: Our speaker for the evening was our very own Scott Doudrick. Scott is owner of a '39 Ford pickup, and is the'webmaster' for our Club's Facebook page. And, best of all, Scott has the most interesting job in the world. He works at NASA JPL, or Jet Propulsion Laboratory, how swell is that! Armed with a great PowerPoint presentation, Scott talked about JPL's planetary exploration missions, more specifically the planet Mars research program and exploratory 'rover' vehicles on the Planet Mars surface. The first rover was Sojourner, which landed on Mars on July 4, 1997. To date, there have been four rover vehicles placed on the surface of Mars. Each vehicle takes 7 to 11 months of travel time to reach Mars. These vehicles explore the Mars planet surface, sending photos and data back to earth for analysis.

Some Rover updates: Scott gave us some updates, starting with Opportunity, one of the early Mars rovers with an interesting twist Rover 'Opportunity' landed on Mars in 2004 and was only expected to last 90 days because of harsh surface conditions. However, it was still going strong until June, 2018, amazing! Since then, despite commands to comminicate, no signal has been heard. Opportunity likely experienced a low-power fault, possibly solar panels inoperative because of dust storm, stay tuned, time will tell! Speaking of dust storms, Scott showed us some time-lapse slides of afore mentioned. Now Scott also mentioned that conditions on Mars surface are harsh, testing the rovers to their limits, and dust storms is one of their challenges, both for visual photography and for proper rover operation. And because it takes around 10 minutes for light or radio waves to travel to and from Mars, it can be a little tricky when technicians maneuver the rovers on the Mars Planet surface.

Is there life out there? Of particular interest is the discovery of methane gas molecules by Rover Curiosity. Methane gas typically comes from living organisms. And meteorites from Mars have been analyzed and found to contain organic material, how intereresting is that!

Cassini's last gasp: Scott mentioned another spacecraft that is a cult hero in the space industry. Cassini was launched in October, 1997 and sent to Saturn. It took 7 years to reach Saturn, traveling 2 billion miles in the process. Its purpose was to explore Saturn, it's rings, and its moons. Years later, after countless orbits around Saturn, discovering new moons, sending valuable photos and data to earth, Cassini ran out of fuel and in September, 2017, finally plunged through Saturn's atmosphere at 76,000 mph until it burned up. What's next from JPL? Scott mentioned the next rover 'Insight', which will be landing on Planet Mars on November 26. Interesting point here, the landing of Insight will be viewable on NASA TV, so stay tuned! What a great presentation, thanks, Scott for sharing this oh so interesting information, good job!

*Raffle*: Handled by Steve Boskovich: Many gifts were won by some very happy people, thanks, Steve for running the raffle.

*Vasken -- Closing Comments*: There will be no Club meeting in December, instead, we'll have our Club Christmas brunch held at 10 am on Sunday December 2. Next 'official' club meeting will be Tuesday January 8. We're skipping the first Tuesday of the new year because it falls on January 1. Happy Thanksgiving, and drive home safely.
