

1939.





Cars and racing weren't his only interests. Family played a big part, too. He and his wife Barbara have five children, including twins and will soon celebrate their 50th wedding anniversary. In addition to driving race cars, he also flew experimental aircraft and still holds a valid pilot's licence. His current projects include a '48 F1 Flatbed, that is almost completed and a '54 pickup, that he has owned since 1956. Although the current roster says he joined the club in 1996, he has been a member off and on since the early seventies. I know there is nothing in the rules and by- laws of the club even remotely regarding what you all did for us, but we do profoundly thank you all.

#### BEEF AND RICE

1 pound beef stew meat, cut into 1
 inch cubes

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 cup water

1 bay leaf

1 teaspoon salt

1/8 to 1/4 teaspoon crushed red peppers

1 cup uncooked regular rice

2 medium green peppers, cut into 1
 inch pieces

1 medium onion, chopped

1/2 to 1 teaspoon curry powder

1/4 teaspoon pepper

Heat oil in 10 inch skillet until hot. Cook and stir beef in oil over medium heat until brown, about 15 minutes. Add water, bay leaf, 1 teaspoon salt and the red peppers. Heat top boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer 45 minutes.

Drain beef, reserving broth. Add enough water to reserved broth to measure 2 cups. Mix beef, broth and remaining ingredients. Poor into ungreased 2 quart casserole. Cover and cook in a 350° oven until liquid is absorbed 45 to 50 minutes. Serves 6.
