

I hope you've all found a way to keep cool during this heatwave. I'm ready to move to the beach for the summer!







## From Blacky's Garage ...

#### Mr. K. R. Wilson and the Ford

What a thrill, while walking through one of my annual swap meets and peering down along the ground, as I usually do, I caught the tell tale glimmer of a red tool. Any flat head guy, or gal, worth their salt will tell you that most K.R Wilson tools, made for repair and servicing of early Fords, are painted red. - Dick Smith calls the color "resale red!" Anyway, for those of you that are not familiar with old K.R. - he's the guy who discovered the need and filled it, when it came to Ford Fixit Tools.

His experience dates back to the very beginning of steam and gasoline powered cars. In 1907 he built the first modern garage in western New York. From 1909 to 1911 he was a Ford and Buick dealer. From 1912 to 1915 he manufactured "57 varieties" of accessories for Fords. Then in 1916 he started an independent Ford Service Station. In this era there was not much service station equipment available. He found that many operations could be done a lot better and much quicker using the right special tool. Mr. Wilson had figured the most needed tool at the time was a bushing reaming machine. Dealers from around Buffalo were invited to come in and try the one he developed. After trying it, many were eager to have one in their own shops and paid in advance, to get one as soon as possible. ... This was the capital that started the K. R. Wilson Company.

In 1926 he wrote and published a book that opened the eyes of Ford Service men and revolutionized repair shop methods. The Ford Motor Company regnized that equipment made by K. R. Wilson Co. And his methods were right.

Arrangements were soon made so Ford dealers around the country could purchase K. R. Wison's tools and equipment directly from the factory at prices previously unheard of.

Of course all of this stuff took place during the Model "T" era, but it set the stage for years to come, as Mr. Wilson continued to produce his tools and equipment for the model "A" and early V-8s.

In a subsequent article I will cover tools and equipment produced for the early V-8 years. ... So long til then.

## From Princess Patti's Pantry ...

#### CHILI RELLANO CASSEROLE

1 lb Montery Jack cheese

1 lb sharp cheddar cheese

2-7oz cans whole green chili peppers

4 eggs

1-13oz can evaporated milk

3 Tbsp flour

1-8oz can tomato sauce

Wash peppers. Clean out seeds. Split in half length-wise and lay flat in 9 X 13 inch pan. Sprinkle half of both cheeses over the peppers. Place second layer of peppers on top and then remaining cheese.

Beat eggs and add milk and flour. Mix until smooth. Poor evenly over cheese and peppers. Bake at 350° about 30 minutes. Top with small can tomato sauce and to oven for 15 minutes.

Terry Davis, from Modesto, was the Boards' unanimous selection to complete the Engle term. If you have not had the pleasure of meeting Terry, I'm sure you have read some of his many contributions to the V-8 Times.
