

#### Car of the Month:

Ron Batesole and his clean 1935 Ford coupe took top honors for Car of the Month. Back in 1975, Ron was browsing the LA Times Classified, and saw the '35 advertised. He drove to Sylmar to have a look, liked what he saw, and bought it. The Ford was sold new at Boyd Gibbons Ford in Los Angeles. It was very original, wasn't hot rodded or cut up. Ron even found a receipt for some maintenance work done in 1941. It did have a later 59AB engine and juice brakes, but it was stock otherwise. So Ron cleaned it up a bit and drove it that way for a few years. Then in 1980 he parked it and did a restoration. He installed an original 21-stud engine rebuilt by H & H Automotive Engine Company, and replaced the juice brakes with the stock mechanicals. Hey, those mechanical binders, when adjusted and lubed properly, can lock 'em up on a hard stop! For the re-paint, Ron used a professional old-school Binks spray gun and shot it in his driveway. He used the original Ford 'Light Gunmetal Gray' in acrylic lacquer, then color sanded and buffed it to a mirror finish. And to finish it off, Ron installed a new LeBaron Bonney interior. We're telling you, he's a real do-it-yourselfer! To make this coupe really stand out, Ron changed the deck lid from original trunk to rumble seat, how swell is that! Most recently, he replaced the old carburetor with a brand new Stromberg 97. Yep, this Ford is built for driving. With a Columbia 2-speed rear end to keep the engine revs down, this cool coupe cruises easily down the road. Nice work, Ron, congratulations on a job well done!

Tours report: Rich and Lynn Carter Upcoming Winery Tour still on track and scheduled for Friday, March 30.



# And now for some "Pressing" News Some new laws.....

#### These are California State Bills SB 1 & AB 1

- Vehicles with a vehicle market value range between (\$0) and (\$4,999), a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25).
- Vehicles with a vehicle market value range between (\$5,000) and (\$24,999), a fee
  of fifty dollars (\$50).
- Vehicles with a vehicle market value range between (\$25,000) and (\$34,999), a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).
- Vehicles with a vehicle market value range between (\$35,000) and (\$59,999), a fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150).
- Vehicles with a vehicle market value range of (\$60,000) and higher, a fee of one hundred seventy-five dollars (\$175).

The above fees will be due in addition to an approx 43% fuel tax increase and \$38.00 vehicle registration fee increase. These additional taxes and fees will cost the average motorists over \$400.00 per year per vehicle. Plus add to the cost of Gas 16 cents, Diesel 20 cents. Both of these bills, if passed into law, would increase the weight fee on all trucks.

The Company is a strong supporter of classic car shows and NHRA drag racing events around the country. And they have a number of local car shows at their facility in Northridge throughout the year and are involved with fund-raisers for local charities. Tony spoke about their product line, then talked about some of the technology and manufacturing processes. Then he shared information about washing their car covers. Generally, using a mild detergant then allowing the cover to air dry vs. machine dry is the way to go. Then our very own Ed Warnock shared his background about being an

employee at California Car Cover, small world! In closing, Tony introduced Brandon Jacobson, Showroom Manager of California Car Cover and latest member of our V-8 Club.
