





Program / Speaker

Program: Ralph Hubbard was our speaker for the evening. Ralph is a Club member and an expert in old Ford pricing and valuation. He's currently in the process of liquidating a collection of over 100 cars, with 50 remaining. This past year, he attended various car auctions including David Gooding, Russo Steele, and Barrett Jackson. His goal: Better understand the present-day old Ford car market. What Ralph discovered was that generally speaking, our old Fords are not selling for what they were in the recent past. Classic cars in general seem to be dropping in value. Some street rods seem to be holding their own. However, fiberglassbodied versions have plummeted in price. Interestingly, reproduction steel-bodied cars have also dropped in value. One example: A '32 Ford with a steel Brookville body sold recently for \$33,000. Eight years ago)2012(, a similar Brookville-bodied street rod sold for \$60,000. So what are some real-world examples of old Ford values? Using a slide presentation orchestrated by Scott Doudrick, Ralph scrolled through photos of numerous early Fords which were recently consigned to auction for sale. These included a variety of years, and ranged from amateur restorations to top-dollar builds. So here's an interesting overview of early Ford's Ralph shared with us: First up was a '32 ford truck, equipped with a 'banger')4-cylinder(engine nicely hopped up, sold at auction for \$22K. Next was a '34 Ford Vicky, original and very nice, went for \$28.6K, cheap! Then there was a '34 Ford Phaeton, very nice, \$44K, very low. A '36 Ford, hopped up with a small block Chevy adapter-plated to the stock Ford running gear, sold for \$78K. A '36 Ford convertible)not a Phaeton(sold for \$27.5K, low, low! A '36 ford 3 window coupe sold for \$78K, high! A '37 Ford truck, mildly souped up, went for \$33K, not a bad price. A '39 ford with Chevy power and A/T yielded \$78.1K. A'40 ford convertible, nicely modified, went for \$46K. A 1940 Merc convertible retro'd/created from a coupe sold for \$55K. A '41 ford pickup, fair condition, velour interior and a

crooked bed, a good 20/20 looker, fetched \$16.5K. A '46 truck, nicely finished in red, went for \$27.5K.)In some opinions, front end not too attractive!(A nice looking '47 Ford coupe with a '46 decklid and chrome trim around the back-quarter windows went for \$9.9K. A 1950 Ford convertible, a 99-point Dearborn car yielded \$38.5K. A 1950 Merc coupe, nice restoration but wrong upholstery, went for 29.8K. On the sale of street rods, Ralph observed that those displaying high quality seemed to be fetching high dollars. In summary, Ralph provided some very insightful, real-world pricing for us. Some of the \$ value information he shared might not have been what we were expecting. However, it's The reality in our day and age. So Ralph's parting advice is probably the best: 'Have fun restoring and driving them'. Thanks, Ralph great info and advice!

Growing up on a farm in Tulare, Ca. in 1953, I was introduced to driving trucks at an early age. At fourteen, my cousin taught me how to drive my Grandpa's 1929 2-ton Model A truck with 8 gears. I would help him out by driving around the farm and picking up alfalfa to feed the cows. He also had a 1940 Chevy pickup truck that I drove around in. I remember driving that to school while in the eighth grade!

In 1954 I moved to Chatsworth to live with my Dad and brother and although I was only 15, began driving his 1952 Ford pickup with an overhead 6 cylinder overhead engine. By 1955, when I began high school, I had purchased my first car...a 1951 Ford Club Coupe, black, with Fordomatic, a rarity, since only 4% of Fords had Fordomatic. I had saved my money from working to buy it. I drove it on my first day of high school to Canoga Park High. I remember parking across the street from school that first day and when I went out to my car after classes, two of my moon hub caps were missing! A commom event in those days.

Well, the 1951 started to have issues, so I purchased my friend's 1947 blue Ford Coupe that was all hopped up. This is the car that I had when Sue and I met. I picked her up for many dates in that car until the transmission went out.

My next car was a beautiful 1950 Ford convertible, painted black with a white top. It had moon hub caps, was lowered and is the car shown in the picture below. This is in 1958 and Sue is wearing my Letterman jacket and I am wearing my FFA jacket. Fun times!

By 1959, I changed cars again and purchased a 1957 Ford Fairlane, a black hardtop. This lasted until we got married in 1961 when for some unknown reason, I purchased my one and only Chevy. I was a 1958 bronze Chevy Biscayne. I saw the error of my ways by 1963 and returned to Fords, Purchasing a 1963 Ford Fairlane.

The rest, they say, is history. Fords forever since then.
