



#### The Crown Victoria Affair (episode 4)

Well, I have been driving the Crown Vicky to various local car events and enjoying it. I have discovered a few interesting facts about the car; it runs on 7 of its 8 cylinders, it smokes like a mosquito abatement vehicle and it leaks a little oil. Other than those issues, I'm having fun with it. Thanks to Jim Ellerbrock's expertise, now it even has a working radio! Last week I decided to see if I could fix some of the problems. Since the smoke seems to come mostly from the right bank of the V8, I decided to start by removing the right valve cover to see what lurked within (I suspected a lot of sludge would be plugging up the cylinder head oil return holes). I got a couple of surprises; first the cylinder head is relatively clean and the holes are not plugged up. Second (see the accompanying pictures) I noticed the cylinder closest to the firewall had only one pushrod. VERY interesting. After a little investigation, I found the pushrod (in the pushrod hole in the cylinder head, but down about 1 ½ inches from where it should have been, hence it had no contact with the rocker arm). I have now removed the intake manifold and the valley cover and the pictures explain it; one broken pushrod, one (the one I found in the cylinder head) gently stuck in the head and not contacting the valve lifter. The explanation for MOST of this is that the valve in question was firmly stuck in the closed position. I have now freed up the valve (lots of PB Blaster and a mixture of ATF/Marvel Mystery Oil). I reinstalled the pushrod and the rocker shaft assembly and I have cranked the engine over on the starter. The valve seems to work fine. Next was a compression test of that cylinder (and maybe the rest of them?). Guess what? NO compression on that cylinder! I have removed that cylinder head and will now check out the valves. You guys with flatheads have it so much easier; no pushrods, no rocker arms, no rocker arm shafts, etc.






### The short story of my life (the car part)


