

Speaker for the Evening: Larry Caplan introduced our guest speaker for the evening: Our very own Ralph Hubbard. Ralph has extensive leadership involvement at the Early Ford V8 Club of America National level, including the office of President. So he is very qualified on all things early V-8 Ford.

Ralph's talk was a continuation of his presentation a few months' prior about hammer prices for early V-8's sold at an auction in Scottsdale, AZ. This auction Ralph attended was hosted by Worldwide Auctioneers, yep, no typo, 'Auctioneers' vs. 'Auctions'.

Quick background Kruse International, then Worldwide Auctioneers: The well-known 'Kruse International' was founded in 1952 by Russell Kruse as a property auction company. They were based in Auburn, Indiana, and eventually they 'branched out': In 1971 on Labor Day, they held their first auction for collectible cars. Over time they became the largest auto auction company in the world. They were noted for conducting the William Harrah's 1,000 car collection sale, also the first to sell a car for \$1 million, a

1934 Duesenberg. They were even asked by Tom Barrett to conduct an auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, ring a bell? Regrettably, over time, they started losing money, stopped paying their customers, and eventually lost their auction license. As a result, Worldwide Auctioneers stepped in to £11 the gar

in to fill the gap.

For the second part of his presentation, Ralph shared the 'hammer' price for numerous Ford's and Mercury's, some nice, some so-so, but all yielding some good pricing, all things considered.


