



Hello Everyone,

We had a very good Feb. meeting! It was nice to see everybody after the holidays.

Tails of the Garage, a Members Story

The Evolution of my garage (and my car collection)

Over the years, as I have acquired more time (and a little more spendable cash) I have also acquired more collector cars. It started more than 60 years ago with a '49 Ford (I guess it wasn't really a collector car, it was just an old car a 16 year old could afford). Many cars followed, most of them at least somewhat interesting. Then along came marriage, kids and a house, and cars became transportation. As time went by, I decided that I needed (?) interesting cars, not just transportation. I kind of merged the two ideas when I bought my '69 GTO convertible (way back in 1972). It was our daily transportation (and our only vehicle until sometime in the middle 70's when America experienced our first 'gas crisis'). I bought a small, used car to commute to work and back and the GTO became a 'collector/fun' car. We didn't have a vehicle storage issue at that time because we only had one collector car and one 'transportation' car. That didn't last long as I continued to look at and eventually buy more collector cars.

Now, on to the garage portion of this; about 15 years ago, I took a look at what I had and where I could park them and realized I had a problem. After some serious marital discussions, we decided that I could absorb our side yard for 'car stuff' and we'd still have a nice backyard. This evolved from an extension to our driveway for access to the 'new' area, to a 20 x 20 concrete slab behind a pair of 10 foot wide by 6 foot high gates. Hooray! I could now park 2 cars behind the gate and 2 more on the new driveway in front of the gate. As time went by, my collection grew from the '69 GTO (which I still have FIFTY YEARS LATER!) to include (one at a time additions) a '49 Chevy Fleetline 4 door, a '53 Studebaker Commander Starliner, a '56 Studebaker Golden Hawk, a '55 Ford Fairlane Crown Victoria and a '62 Studebaker Gran Tursimo Hawk. Where to put all these cars (and to maintain them)? Over a period of a couple years, the 20 x 20 slab became 20 x 50, a 6 foot high vinyl fence surrounded the area, a roof was erected over the rear 30 feet of the area and just recently the roof was extended forward, so that now the entire area is covered. In the last 5 or 6 months, I have run electrical conduit along both sides of the structure (to provide convenient plugs for working with electrical tools as well battery maintainers adjacent to each car) and LED lights strategically placed to illuminate the entire area.

I am writing this article, because I suspect (and in some cases I know) that many of our club members have gone thru similar 'vehicular evolution', and I thought it would be interesting to showcase some of our members' cars/garages. I hope this is somewhat interesting and encourages some of you to write something similar for our newsletter, or invite me to tour YOUR garage and I'll write the articles and take the pictures.
