

This will help prevent a recurring theft. Reseda Muffler also offers anti-theft kits for other cars. Thanks for the tip, Rob.


Actually, This was the 2nd time this happened to My Sons car....

Only this time, they cut the converter, but couldnt cut the safty cable that the muffler shop added, + the crook got caught. So.. back to Reseda Muffler for welding the unit, & 1 more cable added that is visable. (Rob / DLE)

(Secretary's Note: Catalytic converters help clean up the exhaust gases leaving the engine. They also muffle exhaust sound. If you hear a vehicle that looks otherwise stock but has a loud exhaust note, it may be the result of catalytic converter theft, which is on the increase. Precious metals used in the converters make them valuable on the black market: \$200-plus each.)








Speaker for the evening:

Larry Caplan introduced our own Ralph Hubbard, who is the expert of experts on early Ford V-8's and what they're worth. Ralph has quite the background in our hobby. He bought his first FoMoCo car in 1955, a '39 Merc convertible with a rebuilt engine and new brakes, only paid \$85, and could pull 65 mph-plus in second gear. Ralph was hooked. In 1968 he joined the Early Ford V-8 Club of America. Over the years he's held many leadership positions including Chief Judge at several National Meets. He was even National President in 1981! So this guy's got credentials and experience in early Fords like few others.

For our program Ralph discussed early Ford dollar values a subject that we're always interested in. The basis of his up-to-date information was a recent auction in Arizona that Ralph attended for cars from the Ron Thorne early Ford V-8 car collection. Ralph highlighted and discussed the value of many Ford V-8's from that collection. Here are five examples: 1) '32 Ford roadster, nicely restored, participated in the Great American Race in 1985: Sold for \$85,000. 2) '33 Ford Cabriolet convertible, mostly stock-look with beefier tires, dropped front axle and a hopped flathead: Sold for \$65,000. 3) 1932 Ford 3-window Coupe. Only two owners since 1948. Not perfect, #3 condition, but has provenance. Sold for \$50,000. 4) 1933 Ford 3-window coupe. Nice, equipped with a radio, good fit and finish, #2 condition. Sold for \$67,500. 5) 1934 Ford 3-window Coupe. #2 condition, equipped with a radio. Sold for \$49,500. It's not cheap buying a car at an auction. The above prices did not include the 12% fee charged by the Auction company 'World Wide Auctioneers' and the 8% Arizona state tax. So the final out-the-door prices for the above examples were 20% more than the prices shown above. Poorhouse here we come!

Ralph kept us spellbound as he presented the above very pertinent information to our group with a slideshow backdrop. Because of the restaurant modified hours/earlier closing time, Ralph wasn't able to finish his presentation. So he'll be back to another Club meeting soon to summarize and bring us more information about early Ford V-8 pricing. Thanks, Ralph, it's always fascinating and worthwhile to hear your most excellent information about our cars and their values. Looking forward to next time.
