

Sandy's Cars.

This month we are honored to have two cars of the month. They are a 1949 Ford 2 Door Sedan (Li'L Darlin) and a 1951 Ford Convertible (Peachy) both owned by club member Sandy Norris.



1949 Sedan (Li'L Darlin). In High School, Sandy had her own 1949 Ford. This was a big deal for a girl to have her own car at that age. As time moved on, Sandy got married and sold her '49. In 1989 she was diagnosed with a Brain Tumor and later slipped into a coma. At her side, her husband Joe, promised to buy her another '49 Ford if she would just wake up. While in the coma, Sandy said that she could hear his voice but could not move. Thankfully Sandy recovered and she quizzed Joe on what he had said. He said that it was true. They later found this '49, purchased it and began with the customization. Its name came from her husband's favorite song at the time. The car is finished in "Pearl White Paint", and has its original 239 Flathead with Offenhauser Finned Aluminum heads. It also has 1956 Olds Spinner Hubcaps with small globes.



1951 Convertible (Peachy). Sandy and Joe along with partners owned "Mike's Auto Parts" in Burbank. One of the partners had noticed a 1951 Convertible that was up on blocks and was ready to be restored. Joe decided that would be his car to go along with Sandy's '49. It was purchased and restoration was underway. Again, as fate would have it, Joe passed when the car was about 40% complete. The car restoration again went dormant. Joe's partners got together and decided to finish the car to honor Joe. They found the already completed seats that were done in a peach color with white. A PPG paint called "Sweet Georgia Peach" was selected to match the seats. The original 239 Flathead V8 was used along with various Pontiac Trim and 1956 Olds Hubcaps. A complete 1950's Custom.

One Night in Memphis concert






JPL Tour October 5, 2023

On Sept. 26th club members gathered at JPL for a tour that was organized by Scott Doudrick. Scott was unable to join the tour due to his changing work priorities concerning the future launch on the program on which he was working.

Those of us that attended met in the auditorium for a short lecture and movie on some of the projects that JPL has and is currently working on. All un-manned NASA spacecraft projects are handled thru JPL. A full-scale model of the "Voyager I" spacecraft was on display. We them toured the adjacent room where some of the other Spacecraft models were displayed including the early Mars Rovers. They also had Moon Rocks that had been returned.

We then met our very knowledgeable tour guide who led us walking by and into various JPL buildings that housed research labs as well as certain production operations. We ended up in the observation area that overlooks the "High Bay" area where a current Space craft is being assembled. The High Bay is a 4-story open area that is also a high-level clean room that has to meet a certain particle count. All people entering must enter through a pressurized air lock and wear smocks with hoods, masks, gloves and booties. (Brings back memories of when I was working at Hughes Aircraft).

After leaving High Bay, we walked over to the building that houses Misson Control. On the ground floor was a model of the current Mars Rover. It was so much larger and different compared to the early ones that we saw earlier. We proceeded up a stairway were again on an observation deck overlooking multiple control panels. It was explained to us that all of the tracking stations around the world are monitored here. It was also explained on the time required for satellite signals to reach the earth depending on how far out in space they are. This is also where you see the people giving each other high fives when things are successful.

Again, thanks to our tour guides and Scott for organizing this tour. We were also handed flyers and info sheets on various JPL Missons. Ernie Baily has some extras if anyone is interested.

Ernie Baily gave an update on recent group outings such as the visit to JPL in La Canada and attending the show One Night in Memphis at the Fred Kavli Theater.


Bill Greene gave an update on the upcoming Holiday Party.

Seeking assistance ~ ~ ~

My name is Henry Guttormson, and I am the recent owner of a 1937 Ford Phaeton. My car has 2 left hand wind wings on it. The right hand wind wing is not to be found anywhere. I have a suspicion that the left hand and right hand wind wings were mixed up at a restoration or body shop in southern California somewhere. I am in Texas, but my car originally came from the San Diego area and was owned previously by Ollie Smith who was a EFV8 officer at some point in time. My car is on the cover of the January/February 1977 cover of the V8 Times magazine. From this photograph, you can see that the wind wing on the passenger side (right side) is sticking out from the door too far, so it is a left hand wind wing.

My request to you is if you would ask a question to any of your members that own a 1937 Phaeton, 1937 Roadster, and a 1938 Phaeton. The question is:

"Does your car have 2 right hand wind wings mounted on it?" If anyone answers yes to this question, then my follow on question would be: "Would you like to trade a wind wing (or mounting bracket) with me so our cars have the correct wind wings on them?"

[Although the left hand and right hand wind wing assemblies are interchangeable, the wind wing mounting brackets (the part that screws to the windshield post) are mirror images. The brackets have snaps for the top weatherstrip on different sides and so the top weatherstrip will not fit on an incorrectly mounted wind wing.]
